**LETTER FROM CHAIRMAN CHRISTOPHER H. SMITH TO
AMB. JOHN MENZIES**

Dear Ambassador Menzies:

Thank you very much for appearing before the Commission on February 28 to address issues related to Kosovo's displaced and imprisoned. I appreciate this opportunity to follow-up on some points raised in the hearing and look forward to including this letter as well as your response in the final hearing record.

First, your explanation of why the release of the Albanian prisoners in Serbia was not addressed in the "Technical Agreement" differed from that offered by subsequent witnesses. You had said that the subject was not included in previous discussion. According to other testimony, however, it was in early drafts of the agreement but when Yugoslav/Serbian interlocutors objected, the Administration agreed to drop the matter in order to expedite the cessation of the NATO air campaign. Further, none of the U.S. participants involved in the negotiation of this agreement had human rights concerns as a stated part of their portfolio. It would be helpful if you would clarify whether this, indeed, was the case.

Second, also relating to the prisoners, you had noted that there is evidence prisoners have been beaten or otherwise mistreated; others described the treatment as torture. The State Department's *Country Reports on Human Rights Practices for 1999* notes that the use of torture against detainees is widespread in Serbia, but it fell short of confirming that some of the 1,600 or more Kosovar Albanians have been victims of torture. Again, a clarification would be helpful.

Third, in discussing the situation in Kosovo generally, the growth of corruption and prostitution was mentioned. Corruption and the trafficking of women who are forced to work as prostitutes are ongoing and major concerns of the Commission, as well as the OSCE. While not specifically mentioned at the hearing, the Commission has seen reports

that some U.S. personnel are frequenting brothels in Kosovo where trafficked women are being held. Has the United States given instructions to official personnel—civilian and military—prohibiting them from visiting brothels or nightclubs where prostitution is taking place? Are there any wider instructions for the international community as a whole, including members of the OSCE missions?

Fourth, many vulnerable groups are often overlooked in crisis situations, and one relating to Kosovo are those young men who face imprisonment in Serbia and Montenegro because they either left the country when called into service, or deserted while in service. It was noted that NATO had, in fact, encouraged them to do this, by dropping leaflets and broadcasting warnings of the consequences of fighting in Kosovo and encouraging all civilians not to cooperate with the Milosevic regime in its policies in Kosovo. Moreover, as the international community had condemned the Yugoslav military's actions in Kosovo, those who did not wish to be associated with these actions appear to be eligible as refugees. Have any of these conscientious objectors applied for refugee status in the United States? Would the United States Government consider recognizing and welcoming some of these individuals as refugees?

Another vulnerable group is the Romani population of Kosovo. As you know, the Commission leadership wrote to Secretary Albright on July 14, 1999, to express our concern about the Roma in and from Kosovo. Frankly, the Department's reply was unresponsive to the key issues we raised. The Department's letter essentially leaves the fate of Kosovo's Roma in the hands of the UNHCR. But many Roma (like many of the conscientious objectors) are considered internally displaced and, thus far, the UNHCR has not interpreted its guidelines on internally displaced persons to include referring them to third countries for resettlement. In addition, our witnesses stated that the UNHCR will not recommend Roma or others for asylum if they are in third countries such as Hungary, notwithstanding the fact that a significant number of Hungarian Roma have already been found by Canada to have a well founded fear of persecution. In an effort to address these problems, could a presidential determination be issued which would permit the United States to consider certain categories of internally displaced persons in Kosovo, Montenegro, and Serbia as refugees for the purposes of the U.S. resettlement program? In addition, would it be possible for the United States to institute refugee processing out of Podgorica, Montenegro (i.e., INS officers from Zagreb would conduct interviews in Podgorica), as a means of facilitating the processing of resettlement applicants?

Finally, this hearing, as well as our earlier hearing on promoting and protecting democracy in Montenegro, revealed the potential for renewed conflict in either Montenegro or the Presevo region of southern Serbia. I hope that, in preparing for any international response to such conflicts, the United States ensures that contingencies are made in advance to respond to humanitarian crises, and that the criticisms of NATO's air campaign raised recently by Human Rights Watch are taken seriously into account.

As you had indicated in your testimony, Mr. Ambassador, the situation in Kosovo has improved in the sense that the decade or more of harsh Serbian repression was brought to an end. At the same time, much remains to be done to bring civil society, democratic governance and economic recovery to the region. I urge the Administration to take strong action in this regard, in particular by supporting the democratic

change in Serbia itself that would open new possibilities for genuine peace and stability in southeastern Europe. The delivery of those indicted for war crimes, crimes against humanity and genocide are similarly critical to ending the cycle of violence in Kosovo, Bosnia and elsewhere.

Again, Mr. Ambassador, I thank you for participating in the hearing and look forward to your response.

**QUESTIONS SUBMITTED FOR THE RECORD BY
CHAIRMAN CHRISTOPHER H. SMITH TO AMB. JOHN MENZIES**

Question. Your explanation of why the release of the Albanian prisoners in Serbia was not addressed in the ‘Technical Agreement’ differed from that offered by other witnesses. You had said that the subject was not included in previous discussion. According to other testimony, however, it was in early drafts of the agreement but when Yugoslav/Serbian interlocutors objected, the Administration agreed to drop the matter in order to expedite the cessation of the NATO air campaign.... It would be helpful if you would clarify whether this, indeed, was the case.

Answer. The issue was neither addressed in early drafts of the “Technical Agreement” nor in the final text of that Agreement.

Question. You had noted that there is evidence prisoners have been beaten or otherwise mistreated; others described the treatment as torture. The State Department’s Country Reports on Human Rights Practices for 1999 notes that the use of torture against detainees is widespread in Serbia, but it fell short of confirming that some of the 1,600 or more Kosovar Albanians have been victims of torture. Again, a clarification would be helpful.

Answer. The formal annual Human Rights reports follow prescribed formats and definitions that often make it difficult for us to break down facts and issues more narrowly. The absence of confirmation in the report of specific mention of the 1,600 or more Kosovar Albanians that have been victims of torture should not—as my opening statement underscores—be construed as any effort to minimize the enormity of this problem. The Convention against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment defines torture as “any act by which severe pain or suffering, whether physical or mental, is intentionally inflicted on a person for such purposes as obtaining from him or a third person information or a confession, punishing him for an act he or a third person has committed or is suspected of having committed, or intimidating or coercing him or a third person” We have not had access to the ethnic Albanians in custody in Serbia, but I believe it extremely likely that at least some of them have been beaten or otherwise mistreated in the manner defined by the Convention. I do not doubt that in many instances the term “torture” could be employed.

Question. Has the U.S. given instructions to official personnel — civilian and military—prohibiting them from visiting brothels or nightclubs where prostitution is taking place? Are there any wider instructions for the international community as a whole, including members of the OSCE missions?

Answer. KFOR troops are governed by national regulations and the standing orders of their respective local commanders on the “brothels and nightclubs” question. U.S. KFOR troops are proscribed from patronizing brothels and prostitutes in the region. The OSCE maintains a Code of Conduct that instructs members of OSCE missions not to partake in conduct unbecoming of members of an international mission. The U.S. is strongly committed to fighting trafficking in the OSCE region, including the Balkans. Since April 1999, the U.S. has provided the OSCE’s Office of Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (ODIHR) with an expert who has prepared an Action Plan to Combat

Trafficking in Human Beings in the OSCE region. ODIHR's Action Plan proposes to improve States' ability to combat trafficking through stronger legislation, training for law enforcement officials, and outreach with the NGO community. It also recommends OSCE provide members of OSCE Missions in the Balkans with training on the problem of trafficking. The U.S. strongly supports the Action Plan. In November at the OSCE Summit in Istanbul, the First Lady pledged, pending Congressional approval, \$300,000 to support OSCE/ODIHR efforts to combat trafficking, including specific Action Plan projects. We are pleased to report that several other States (Norway, Switzerland, Austria) have similarly pledged support for ODIHR's Action Plan.

Question. Have any of these conscientious objectors (i.e., young Serb men who deserted or left the country during the bombing campaign) applied for refugee status in the U.S.? Would the U.S. government consider recognizing and welcoming some of these individuals as refugees?

Answer. Resettlement is one of many tools for helping refugees. Worldwide, the effort is towards return and or regional solutions rather than resettlement. Resettlement is used in most difficult cases, such as UNHCR referrals and carefully defined groups of special interest, e.g., Bosnian torture victims or relatives of those already in the U.S. legally. To put this question in perspective, I note that, of the over 12,000,000 refugees worldwide, fewer than 80,000 will receive U.S. resettlement this year. Conscientious Objectors. We are in close contact with our embassy in Budapest and UNHCR regarding Serbs who either deserted or refused to enlist. Hungary has granted "humanitarian status" which allows these people access to jobs and social benefits for at least one year. There is no danger of expulsion or rejection (refoulement) to Serbia. Neither Hungary nor UNHCR has suggested resettlement would be appropriate. The only cases accepted for resettlement have come under family reunification. The U.S. stands ready to interview for refugee admission any case referred by UNHCR.

Question. Could a presidential determination be issued which would permit the U.S. to consider certain categories of internally displaced persons (i.e., Romani) in Kosovo, Montenegro, and Serbia as refugees for the purposes of the U.S. resettlement program? In addition, would it be possible for the U.S. to institute refugee processing out of Podgorica, Montenegro (i.e., INS officers from Zagreb would conduct interviews in Podgorica), as a means of facilitating the processing of resettlement applicants?

Answer. Roma. According to U.S. and IOM processing staff in Macedonia, over 50 Roma were admitted to the U.S. in the Humanitarian Evacuation Program. Many Roma, including Ashkaly Roma, chose not to be identified as Roma. As with most refugees, the U.S. seeks a regional solution for Roma displaced during the Kosovo conflict. The U.S. supports the orderly of refugees and the internally displaced to their homes. A Presidential Determination allowing for in-country processing for the internally displaced is not contemplated at this time as it would contradict current efforts to restore stability and multi-ethnic communities in the region. Montenegro Processing. A secure environment for U.S. officials to conduct refugee processing in Montenegro is not available at this time.

Question. I hope that, in preparing for any international response to such conflicts (in Montenegro or Presevo), the U.S. ensures that contingencies are made in advance to respond to humanitarian crises, and that the criticisms of NATO's air campaign raised recently by Human Rights Watch are taken seriously into account.

Answer. There is no basis for the Yugoslav war crimes tribunal to launch an investigation into NATO actions during the Kosovo conflict. As we have frequently stated, NATO fully incorporated the laws of armed conflict in training, targeting and operational decisions in Kosovo. Extraordinary efforts were taken to minimize collateral damage. We were dismayed by even the small numbers of civilians killed or injured by NATO action.

This is in sharp contrast to Milosevic's campaign in Kosovo, the essence of which was to inflict civilian casualties on the Kosovar Albanian people. That is why an international tribunal indicted Milosevic for war crimes last spring during NATO's operation that successfully sought to bring an end to his military and paramilitary campaign against the people of Kosovo. ICTY Prosecutor Carla Del Ponte herself has said previously that "NATO is not under investigation" and "There is no formal inquiry into the actions of NATO during the conflict in Kosovo."*

Question. "I urge the Administration to take strong action...in particular by supporting the democratic change in Serbia itself..."

Answer. The U.S. has already taken a number of steps, and continues efforts, to foster democratic change in Serbia. We would be pleased to provide a full briefing on this matter.

**VISIT TO KOSOVO AND MACEDONIA—ETHNIC ALBANIANS
RETURN HOME TO POST-WAR KOSOVO**

**AUGUST 29 - 31, 1999
REPORT BY U.S. REP FRANK R. WOLF**

This report details my third visit this year relating to the Kosovo conflict. I went to Kosovo, Albania and Macedonia in February and later visited Kosovar refugees in Tirana and Kukes in April. The current trip was to Kosovo and Macedonia. I spent Sunday, August 29, and Monday, August 30, in Kosovo and traveled to Skopje, Macedonia, on Tuesday, August 31. This report gives an overview of my post-war trip as well as specific concerns and recommendations. On my arrival in Pristina on a World Food Programme (WFP) flight from Rome, Italy, I was greeted by WFP and U.S. State Department personnel and taken by helicopter to view from the air the destruction of villages in the area between Pristina, Gjakova and Prizren.

GJAKOVA

Our first stop was the WFP operation center and food warehouse in Gjakova. A group of local citizens as well as the mayor and vice-mayor gathered to tell of their experiences during the conflict and voice their present concerns. Between 40 and 50 percent of the homes (about 5,500) in Gjakova have been destroyed or substantially damaged.

Some of the homes were burned as early as the summer of 1998. Some of the destruction was done by local Serbs known to their Albanian neighbors. One man told of a neighbor he had known for 50 years taking part in the burnings along with his wife and son who were dressed in para-military garb.

Most of the destruction, however, was done by masked or unknown para-military bands with some participation by Russian mercenaries. One woman in the group recounted seeing her husband, brother, and brother-in-law shot in her house. She then watched her home burned to the ground. More than 1,000 Kosovar Albanians in town were executed and there are still 1,200 men missing. The men in town who were not executed were taken away. The women and children were sent to a local factory and then told to leave the town immediately.

When asked if they could live together with Serbs in their town again, each person agreed that the memories were too fresh and none could see how it would be possible. Their main concern now is for the 1,200 missing men whom they believe are being held as prisoners in Serbia. Shelter is also a consideration. Many are still living in tents as they attempt to rebuild their homes. They did say they planned to start school soon for their children.

We then went by car on a tour of the town. There was extensive damage with whole streets of homes completely destroyed. The rebuilding effort was evident with much of the debris having been removed and some construction begun.

PRIZEN

There was little physical damage inside the city. Many surrounding villages had been destroyed and it was felt that the city was to have been the next target, but the NATO bombing prevented it. Prizren is very over-crowded as many of the outlying villagers have returned

from refugee camps and moved into the city. This will be a problem as winter arrives, as more people from outlying areas come to the city when they are unable to build adequate shelter in time for winter.

We visited a waterworks plant where USAID/OTI (Office of Transition Initiatives) is working with local citizens to replace the pumps for the station which provides water to the city and many of the surrounding villages. The Kosovars we spoke with are concerned about the need for jobs for their young people. They also said that “good” Serbs are welcome to return to Prizren.

Just down the street from the water plant we stopped at a Serbian seminary guarded by German KFOR troops. Some 211 Serbs and Romas (Gypsies) are living there in crowded conditions. Those we spoke with expressed fear and will not leave the confines of the seminary grounds. The German soldier in charge told us there are also 13 additional Serbs living in homes just behind the seminary and 20 others in outlying parts of Prizren. These are the only known Serbs remaining in the city.

We were shown a house belonging to a Serb family which had been fire bombed a few days earlier. The fire had spread by the wind and also accidentally destroyed nearby Albanian homes. As a result, two local Albanian photographers, one who had fought with the KLA, created a poster appealing to their fellow Kosovars to “stop the burning.” This poster is being used in a campaign funded by USAID/OTI as part of their co-existence/reconciliation projects and appears plastered all over the city.

Sunday night was spent in Pristina, where we met with WFP and State Department officials working in the country.

On Monday we met with various Kosovar political leaders, representatives of nine Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) working in the relief efforts, USAID country and regional directors, U.S. Brigadier General Brandenburg (highest ranking American in KFOR), and spokesman for UNMIK (United Nations Mission in Kosovo, the civilian arm). We also visited Camp Bondsteel, the military compound in the U.S. sector where we were briefed by General Peterson and his staff on the military work with KFOR. Our American soldiers are doing an excellent job and are well led. They are living in conditions that in the summer were either dusty or muddy and will be extremely cold in the winter. Seeing the massive undertaking of Camp Bondsteel leads me to believe our troops will be in Kosovo a long time.

CONCERNS

- The long picture. I believe this will be a slow recovery and that problems will remain for many years. All NATO countries need to address this. The bulk of rebuilding should be carried out by the European countries since the U.S. carried the major burden during the fighting.

- Reconciliation. Bringing reconciliation in Kosovo is going to be very difficult. In neighboring Bosnia, NATO troops have established peace and there appears to be normalcy in Sarajevo. However, in spite of what President Clinton has said, there has been very little progress in reconciliation. To this day, Sarajevo is practically void of Serbs. Serbs in the Bosnian Republic of Serbska seldom venture into Bosnia-Herzegovina, and Bosnian Muslims rarely go up to the Republic of Serbska. Tension also remains between Croats and Bosnians in areas such as Mostar. So we should not be naive about reconciliation prospects in Kosovo. Albanian retaliation against Serbs. Killings, disappearances, harassment and burning of homes occurs almost daily. Albanians are losing their moral high ground as their violence against Serbs continues.
- Missing Albanians. 7,000 plus Albanians are still missing and are believed to be held in Serbian prisons.
- Demilitarization of KLA. KLA weapons and uniforms are to be turned in on September 19. Will they all comply? And what will their future be as they shift focus to possible roles in the civic arena?
- Food and Shelter. These will continue to be pressing needs especially during the winter.
- Migration. People may return to Albania and Macedonia for the winter, creating a problem for those countries. People from mountains and outlying areas are moving into the urban areas for winter shelter and will overburden the cities and towns. Further, Serbs from Kosovo are continuing to move into Serbia and are unwanted there.
- De-mining operations. Extent of remaining Serb-planted mines and unexploded NATO ordinance used in bombing raids is unknown.
- Youth. The absence of jobs and employment opportunities has yielded large numbers of idle youth who spend their time on the streets and in cafes. This could mean future trouble. There will also be many psychological problems among all segments of the population.
- Organized Crime. Law and order is a huge concern. Drug addiction is moving heavily into the larger cities. The region has a strategic location and a history of criminal activity. See attached Italy Daily article.
- Leadership. Many of the problems in the Balkans have come from leadership of people who have incited ultra-nationalism and violence (Milosevic and Tudjman). Few leaders speak in terms of reconciliation and justice. There is a leadership vacuum in Kosovo as well.

- Terrorism. Kosovo could become a center for terrorist activity which would threaten Europe and the U.S. While there are many looming problems, I was encouraged about the spirit of the Albanian Kosovars. They obviously want to rebuild and improve their lives and I was much impressed with their entrepreneurial outlook. They seem to be actively working on their own, rebuilding homes and businesses and taking the initiative to improve their situations. Nearly every Kosovar Albanian I spoke with expressed gratitude for the help of the U.S. both during and after the conflict.
- Recommendations
- Ibrahim Rugova seems to be the best hope for unifying Kosovo at this time and we should encourage him. He has a lot of residual respect among the people for his years of speaking up for them. He is committed to non- violence and is a known commodity to the West. Ideally he should bring some of the younger, new blood to serve with him. Some people have been critical of President Rugova because he has not been out among the people since the fighting ended. Others, however, have expressed concern for his personal safety as he moves about the country.
- Support for food programs should be continued. WFP estimates that 80 percent of the Kosovar population will need food assistance through the winter.
- There will be need for psychological help after the physical rebuilding. The spiritual dimension should also be addressed. • The U.N. and the U.S. should press the issue of missing Albanians thought to be held in Serbian prisons.
- The whole region could become a center of organized crime activity involving drugs, prostitution, smuggling and ensuing violence that will affect all of Europe and the U.S. This looms as a huge problem which should be promptly addressed. Serious consideration should be given to establishing a U.S. anti-crime advisory program in the Balkans/Eastern Europe. Crime of all kinds is growing throughout Russia and Eastern Europe including this area. Gangs from Albania are already active in Kosovo. This must be a priority concern to the U.S. Administration and Congress. We are now seeing evidence of money laundering, drugs, prostitution and other organized crime activities being exported from this region to the West, including the U.S. An effort should be made to mobilize young people in the reconstruction and rebuilding activity. Lack of constructive activities and purpose for the youth and young adult population is a concern to many I met.
- While the Serb population in Kosovo has decreased significantly, we should support programs that address reconciliation. The “stop the burning” poster project in Prizren is a good example. USAID/ OTI has other possibilities with the Art Media Performance group also in Prizren.

- In the end I believe that independence of Kosovo is the only thing that will be acceptable. The Kosovars did not endure all they did to accept anything short of independence from Serbia. Acknowledgments I wish to give special thanks to State Department personnel who arranged our meetings in Kosovo and accompanied us both days. Also thanks to the World Food Programme, particularly Mr. Mick Lorentzen, for all their assistance. We left Pristina Tuesday morning to drive to Skopje, Macedonia. While there, I met with Arben Xhaferi, member of the Assembly of the Republic of Macedonia and a leader of the Albanian political party. I also met with Boris Trajovski, deputy minister of Foreign Affairs and candidate for president in the upcoming October elections. I was very ably accompanied by Ms. Laura Kirkconnell, U.S. deputy chief of mission in our embassy.
